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Monument to Love features a journey Jacky Comforty took with his mother, Ika Comforty Ovadia, for over 25 years to research, document, and uncover the narrative of the Jewish people during the Holocaust in Bulgaria. As the journey progressed, Ika's personal story unfolded. She shared memories and read passages from her diary which revealed her observations, thoughts and feelings, as a young woman, facing a broken world, plunging into war. Kind acts of friendship she experienced contrast the cruel times and the dangers she and others escaped. Ika's story is an anti-war manifesto, confronting totalitarianism and supremacy, and erecting a monument to love.

Some thirty-five years ago, I became interested in Bulgarian Jews, and the Holocaust. At that time, I was a young scriptwriter and director of comedy. I was close with my parents who were Bulgarian Jewish immigrants in Israel and supported my artistic aspirations. They once told me that, "There is one story you must tell, which is how we were saved during the Holocaust." I had never heard the story before and at the time recorded this conversation on an audio-cassette tape.

The conversation with my parents began the process of learning, researching, interviewing and creating multiple documentation projects about the Holocaust and its effect all over Europe, and paricularly in Bulgaria. Over the years, I conducted about 250 oral histories which I used to produce four full-length documentaries and a dozen short movies. "Monument to Love " is a result of 35 years of collection and documentation. The richness of the story and the depth of the work are clearly visible in the film.

When I started to explore our heritage, the common notion was that there was no Holocaust in Bulgaria and that our people were saved. I interviewed hundreds of people, documented places and events, and collected archival films and photos. The story became more complex, and sometimes darker. I set out to document how they were saved. Yet, the stories people told were of resilience, resistance and survival and of friendships and kindness among common people, that were stronger than fascism, propaganda and hatred.

Director's Statement

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My mom was very supportive and active from the start. She collected photos and took notes for me, researched bibliography and documents, and provided a personal context. She joined me on two trips to Bulgaria in 1990 and in 1999. At first, I wanted to hear mostly about historical events. Her role as witness was marginal. Over the years we kept exploring other aspects of her story and our mutual interest in the education of young children.

At some late stage of our journey she even found her lost diary that provided a timely perspective. It took 30 years to film and tell this story. Through sharing voices and memories of those who survived the times, we construct a panorama of personal history, thoughts and diary entries, in response to the events of the time. We always were close, but the process of learning and our dialogue throughout the journey brought us closer, and helped us capture the essence of the story orally and the passing it on.

About the filmmaker:

Jacky Comforty is an award-winning documentary filmmaker whose groundbreaking films have been shot in the United States, Germany, Israel, and Bulgaria. With decades of experience in independent film production focusing on both models of inclusive education and Holocaust Studies, he has developed a multidisciplinary, multicultural, and multilingual approach to collecting oral histories and creating meaningful projects, placing emphasis on nonintrusive, non-scripted methodologies for documentation.

His credits include: *Balkan Jazz* (2013), *The Optimists* (2001), *In the Shadow of Memory (1998)*, and *Through a Glass, Lightly* (1996). Among numerous other distinctions, Comforty has received the Berlin Festival Peace Prize, the Jerusalem Film Festival's Jewish Experience Award, a CINE Golden Eagle award, the American Association of Museums MUSE award, and the Chicago International Gold Hugo Award.

The stolen narrative of the Bulgarian Jews and the

Holocaust

BOOK REVIEW

This book by Jacky Comforty (with Martha Aladjem Bloomfield) is at once a research project about Bulgarian Jews during the Holocaust and an intimate narrative brought to life in evocative prose. I feel I owe it to the book's author and to all those who left the door to their memories ajar to keep my review on the borderline between the academic and the personal. Here are the facts. At the end of 1940, the Bulgarian National Assembly adopted the Law for the Protection of the Nation; the Law imposed anti-Jewish measures and came into force in January 1941. These measures included, among other things, compulsory labor conscription for men and their forced imprisonment in labor camps. In compliance with its agreement with Nazi Germany, in early 1943 the Bulgarian government prepared for the deportation of the Jewish population. A group of parliamentarians, clerical leaders, and citizens exerted pressure to countermand this decision, however. On 24 May 1943, the deportation plan was put on hold and the majority of Bulgarian Jews survived. Those who escaped deportation were some 48,000 Jews holding Bulgarian citizenship from the so-called "old" territories, meaning those within the borders that had been in place prior to April 1941. In contrast, 11,343 Jews from the "new" territories – the lands of Yugoslavia and Greece occupied by Bulgaria from 1941 – did not hold Bulgarian citizenship and were sent to Treblinka and exterminated. Despite numerous documents available showing that the deportations were the responsibility of the Bulgarian state, the refusal to acknowledge these facts is striking. Not a single government or political leader has officially assumed responsibility for the Holocaust in Bulgaria.

In recent years, the fate of Bulgarian Jews and Jews from the territories under Bulgarian rule has sparked considerable research interest. Notably, the most outstanding studies originate outside of Bulgaria rather than inside the country. However, the events surrounding Jews' fate within Bulgarian territories have always been politicized. The dominant narrative of the rescue of Bulgarian Jews originated during state socialism. This could be seen as a cloaking device, in that the discourse about Bulgarian Jews covered the forced assimilation campaigns of citizens of Turkish origin. In the years following 1989 the rescue narrative came to dominate the Bulgarian state's attempts to construct positive images of Bulgaria in the world and to improve the self-esteem of Bulgarians. The more dominant this narrative, however, the more "stolen" the account of the Holocaust in Bulgaria becomes, especially in terms of asking from what or whom the Jews needed to be rescued during the war and what the fate of the deported turned out to be. The state purposefully deploys propaganda campaigns for its own exoneration, and these campaigns involve representatives from well-known scientific and academic institutions. These campaigns reached a climax during the recent commemoration of the 80th anniversary of the rescue orchestrated by the head of state, President Rumen Radev, and some heirs of King Boris III, royal courtiers, and individuals close to the former secret services of the Communist Party.

It is imperative to situate Comforty's work within these developments. Comforty endeavors to allow the survivors of the Holocaust in Bulgaria to honestly and frankly revisit their memories and to produce an unbiased counter-narrative that challenges

the state's myth-making machine, extends beyond the academic realm, and amounts to a vindication of the truth. Comforty's personal story is relevant here; Comforty is a descendant of survivors and a migrant child lost between Bulgarian and Hebrew and between silence and a lifting of the veil that covers the past. The inclusion of his own experiences lends additional legitimacy to his academic research. As the author himself writes:

The Stolen Narrative of the Bulgarian Jews and the Holocaust is about memories and forgetfulness and using hands and facial expressions to help tell a story, sometimes with limited language acquired as an immigrant or in a colorful, native language. Memories faded in front of our camera, constant dissonance and collision between public and private memory, official memory and propaganda, between post-trauma and amnesia. (xxviii)

As a filmmaker Comforty adeptly navigates us through the history of the Jews in the Bulgarian lands in order to tell us the story of who "we" are – of the ways the collective identity of Balkan Jews was formed. Ultimately, he compels us to confront Jews' fate during the dark years of World War II.


What is of most significant value in Comforty's book, though, are the stories of the people who survived. These stories acquire a new life through Comforty's text. This is the case with Rachel Israel Bali. Bali waited for the return of her husband, who was interned in a labor camp, with a child in her arms; her son met his father only at the age of two. We should remember, however, that the book is not only a story of survivors; it is also about those who resisted. Rachel's husband, Solomon Bali, for instance, was also a guerilla who resisted the regime. I am writing these lines in the days following October 7, when we had to encounter the truth that "Never again!" is actually happening right now. I believe the voices of those who fought evil in Comforty's book give us strength in these difficult times to deal with reborn menaces.

The research is also a vindication of rescuers who are genuinely worthy of praise because they lent a hand to friends and neighbors when they all lived together under the swastika. As such, the book moves us beyond the state propaganda machine that tries to decorate only the Communist leader Todor Zhivkov and King Boris III with the rescuer crown. For these reasons, this book represents a brave act of citizenship. It is an example of the kind of committed research we need, especially at a time when propaganda is becoming easier to disseminate and while post-truth is gaining ground.

The Documentary 'Monument to Love' How Bulgarian Jews Escaped the Holocaust

For Bloomingtonian Jacky Comforty, the painstaking documentation of Holocaust history in Bulgaria has been a labor of love for the last 35 years.

Comforty is best known for *The Optimists*, a 2001 film documenting the escape of 50,000 Bulgarian Jews from deportation. His latest documentary, *Monument to Love*, is the first of a trilogy that will tell the survivors' full story—as well as the tragedy of 13,000 who were deported. Topics explored include dehumanization, industrialization of death, the power of community, and the manipulative role of propaganda.

Monument to Love is a journey taken with Comforty's mother, Ika Comforty Ovadia, who died in 2011. Ovadia kept a diary when she was 19 in 1939 that proves to be a treasure trove of information that she reads from over the course of the film, sharing her impressions of the war coming, Hitler's rise to power, and reflections on the value of every human being despite cultural differences or disabilities. "I always felt [*The Optimists*] didn't tell the full story—almost like a highlight film," shares Comforty, who is also founder of The Learning Project, which documents children with disabilities in real-life situations.

"Through all these connections I was able to tell her story and summed up, more or less, the female experience of the war in Bulgaria," says Comforty. "My dilemma was how not to make it a monument to my mom by an admiring son."

Monument to Love premiered in May 2023 at Tel Aviv Cinematheque in Israel during an international conference Comforty organized entitled "Persecution and Collaboration, Rescue and Survival: New Perspectives Regarding Bulgaria and the Holocaust 80 Years Later." The film has since garnered more than 50 awards at international film festivals.

Comforty says that while most of the Jewish population in Bulgaria survived, it was "despite the interest of the government to hand them over for deportation." Because the Jews were so well integrated into Bulgarian society, they were able to mobilize personal relationships for protection.

"There were people designated to be a connection to this person or another person if something were to happen," says Comforty. "It was those friendships that stood in the way of deporting the Jews because so many different people had close friends who believed they shouldn't be persecuted for being who they are."

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

В края на месец декември 2023 г. научихме, че за найдобър документален филм на Международния филмов фестивал Zeal в Париж е избран филмът "Паметник на любовта" на сценариста и режисьора Джеки Комфорти, който заедно със сценаристката Марта Аладжем Блумфийлд са спечелили и сертификат за отлични постижения на наградата за сценарий. През 2023 година "Паметник на любовта" участва и в няколко други фестивали и конкурси. В началото на месец декември той беше включен в официалната селекция на Международните филмови награди на Източна Европа (ЕЕІМА) - месечен и годишен филмов конкурс с публична прожекция, който се провежда в Измир всеки месец.

Искрено се радваме на високите оценки, които получава



филмът "Паметник на любовта" и сърдечно поздравяваме неговия създател Джеки Комфорти. Не само защото той е дълбоко свързан с историята и настоящето на България и българските евреи, но и защото този филм се появи във времето, когато отбелязахме осемдесетгодишнината от спасяването на българските евреи от депортация в нацистките лагери на смъртта и чрез него световната общественост има възможност да научи по убедителен и въздействащ начин истината за т.нар. "български случай". Филмът е и естествено свързан с публикуваната през 2022 г. в САЩ книга на Джеки Комфорти и Марта Аладжем Блумфийлд "Откраднатият разказ на българските евреи и Холокоста". С нея и с работни фрагменти от бъдещия филм имахме възможност да се запознаем по време на представянето им на срещата с Джеки Комфорти в Еврейския културен дом при гостуването му в края на май 2022 г. (виж "Еврейски вести", бр. 11 - 2022).

"ПАМЕТНИК НА ЛЮБОВТА" е деветдесетминутен документален филм за продължилото над 35 години пътуване на автора с майка му Ика Комфорти Овадия, посветено на проучването, документирането и разкриването на разказа за живота на евреите по време на Холокоста в България. Това е трогателен и дълбоко вълнуващ документален филм, който надхвърля времето и границите. Действието се разгръща като многослоен разказ, преплитайки личната история с по-широкия исторически контекст. По време

изводство намират проява в прецизната изработка на "Паметник на любовта". Мултидисциплинарният и мултикултурен подход на Комфорти гарантира, че филмът улавя не само историческите събития, но и нюансираните емоции и междуличностните връзки, които определят човешкия опит по време на бедствия. В основата на документалния филм е темата за любовта като сила, която надхвърля религиозни, културни и исторически граници. Началното изказване на Ика, че "Любовта е най-великата сила на света", служи като водеш принцип в развитието на целия филм. Акцентът върху любовта се превръща в окуляр, през който преминават историите за устойчивост, съпротива и оцеляване. Тя се превръща в движещата сила, която обединява хората и им позволява да преживеят най-тъмните периоди от историята. Заглавието на филма "Паметник на любовта" служи като метафорична структура, изградена от колективните спомени и споделените разкази на онези, които са живели през Холокоста. През обектива на пътуването на Ика Джеки Комфорти изгражда мощен антивоенен манифест. Документалният филм се превръща в свидетелство за непреходната

ването на омразата, насилието и тъмнината.

Изборът на формати за заснемане, включително 16 mm, Beta SP, Mini DV и Digital, допринася за визуалното богатство на филма. Включването на чернобели кадри добавя носталгично и историческо измерение, докато цветните кадри засилват емоционалната дълбочина на съвременните интервюта. Използваните множество езици (български, английски, немски и иврит) отразяват мултикултурния характер на разказа, подчертавайки универсалността на човешкия опит. "Паметник на любовта" не е просто документален филм. Това е прочувствено изследване на наследството. човечеството и трайните уроци на историята. Джеки Комфорти, заедно със съсценаристката Марта Аладжем Блумфийлд са създали филм, който отеква отвъд екрана, приканвайки публиката да размишлява върху трансформиращата сила на любовта, важността на запазването на личните разкази и колективната отговорност да се гарантира, че историите за съпричастност и достойнство се предават на бъдещите поколения. По този начин те създадоха кинематографичен паметник, свидетелство за несломимия човешки дух.


